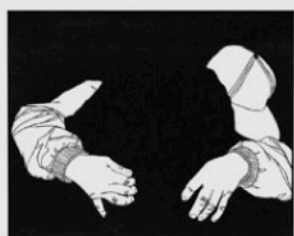

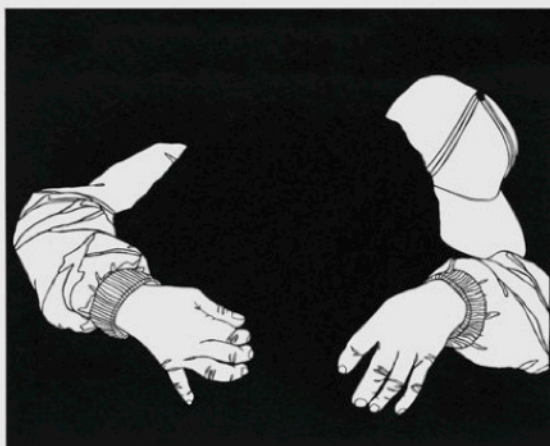

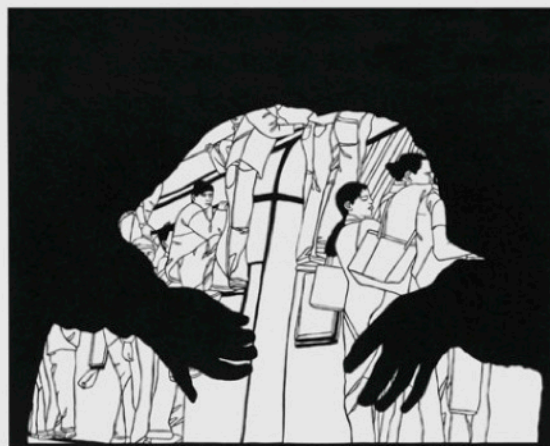

Portraying images of intimate moments, the solo exhibition as well as the self-published book, produced with the support of the Israeli Lottery Council for Culture and Arts, are comforting reminders of the fleeting moments in life we wish to capture, as well as contrasting alerts that tell us to question our experiences and the truth behind reality.

The medium Yekutieli implements can be credited for the fragile feeling in her work; a delicate paper-cutting technique that reminds the viewer of the frailty of the exposed moments being exhibited. "In the book I try to 'break down' moments into layers that usually in the brief moments and time capsule we are 'present' in, it is impossible to do," says Yekutieli.

Constantly questioning the ripples of life's experiences, Yekutieli's recent works make us wonder what moments in life have shaped us the most, and whether we had to be participants in the experiences in order for them to make an impact on us.
